# **Breastfeeding Support**

A breast feeding support group is held the 1st Friday of every month from 11:30-12:30 at the Kalona Library. You do not have to be enrolled in the maternal health program to attend. All groups are led by the maternal health nurse who is a certified breastfeeding counselor.

# <u>WIC</u>

WIC is available the same time as maternal health clinics. You see the nutritionist twice during pregnancy and once after delivery. To qualify, you must take your baby to a WIC session. Call (319)356-6042 or (310)653-7758 ext. 123 to schedule an appointment.
